Half Term 1 & 2	Language Paper 1 - Explorations in Creative Reading and Writing	Pupils will be exposed to a range of 20th and 21st century fiction texts from a range of different contexts. Pupils will be fully immersed into a literary world in which they can explore and engage with a range of fiction. Students will develop an ability to read critically and to respond to unseen fiction literary extracts. Pupils will be given opportunities to explore how writers establish setting, develop character and construct an engaging plot with an effective resolution. As students develop their understanding of how Section A (Reading Paper) is crafted then they will begin to adapt their writing for a range of purposes and audiences which will involve a process to edit and proof-read their writing in preparation for the examination in which they are required to craft. Students will learn to write for an audience and purpose and will develop their creative writing skills in both descriptive and narrative writing. As this takes place, students will learn to restructure their writing to improve consistency and clarity.	Paper 1 exam	Homework throughout the term will continually recap the skills from lessons in preparation for the exam.	A range of texts will be chosen by teaching staff to educate students on the wider world from the past, present and future.
Half Term 3 & 4	Language Paper 2 - Writers' Viewpoints and Perspectives	Pupils will explore a range of non-fiction texts written in the 19th, 20th and 21st century and will focus on comparing and making links between them. Pupils will focus on how writers use language and structure to communicate their ideas and evaluate the impact and effect. Students will develop an ability to read critically and to respond to unseen non-fiction literary extracts. Engage with the reading of fiction and non-fiction. Students will develop their skills from Language Paper 1 to analyse writers' choices of vocabulary, form and structure. Skills will develop to summarise carefully selected information to then organise key ideas, facts and points. Students will learn how to plan writing to argue, persuade and advise and use vocabulary and grammar effectively to create a meaning for an audience and how to use a range of devices in writing to develop ideas. Pupils will focus on developing their skills in writing their own non-fiction texts. These will include: letters, speeches, reports, articles, blogs, etc. Pupils will explore the key characteristics of each genre and be taught how to adapt their writing for different audiences and purposes	Paper 2 exam
