Half Term 1	Topic 1: Me, my family and friends	This first GCSE topic allows students to revise giving personal information whilst expressing ideas and opinions about relationships with family and friends. Half Term 2	Topic 2: Technology in everyday life <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Social media • Mobile technology 	Through the topic of Technology in everyday life students will talk about their use of social media and how they communicate online. They will discuss the advantages and disadvantages of mobile technology, with a focus on the dangers of new technologies and safety online. <p>Half Term 5</p>	<p>Topic 5: Home, town, neighbourhood and region</p>	<p>Topic 5 mixes the cultural aspect of language learning with the students' production skills, as they embark onto discovering other places around the world through comprehension tasks as well as describing their home and the area where they live.
